Commissioner Mike Paradis opened the Adams County Commissioner meeting at 9:07 a.m.

Doris Baker joined the meeting.

MOTION AND ORDER TO AMEND AGENDA:

Joe Holmes, Commissioner, moves that this governing body, pursuant to Idaho Code §74-204, amend the agenda for the meeting as follows:

Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion to amend the agenda. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

OLD BUSINESS:

Packer John Cabin: Work on cabin – The Board wishes to discuss the Packer John cabin with the Adams County Historical Society. Clerk Ward informed the Board that a meeting is planned on November 23rd to discuss Packer John with the Adams County Historical Society.

Inmates: The County Jail houses currently 23 inmates.


November 5, 2015: CWMA spraying of Yellow starthistle on three properties in the Mesa area.

MOTION AND ORDER TO AMEND AGENDA:

Joe Holmes, Commissioner, moves that this governing body, pursuant to Idaho Code §74-204, amend the agenda for the meeting as follows: Lost Creek/Boulder Creek agreement discussion.

Adams County Board of Commissioner Minutes

November 23, 2015 – Motion and Order To Amend Agenda Continued:

The listed amendment is time sensitive and needs to be addressed.

Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion to amend agenda. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

OLD BUSINESS:

Packer John Cabin: Work on cabin – Letter from Adams County Historical Society.

Walker Ranch: The Prosecutor is working on a draft road development agreement.

NEW BUSINESS:

RESOLUTION/REFUGEES: Present Jeff Howard, Sean Smith and Linda Davenport.

Mr. Howard presented a resolution to the Board, which declares the Board's opposition to the relocation of refugees into Adams County and the rejection of state and federal funds to assist in the program. The commissioners discussed the resolution, decided to wait until Chairman Bill Brown joined the meeting to make a decision.

After the Chairman arrived, the Board decided to put the resolution on the next meeting's agenda to discuss further.

SOLID WASTE MATTERS – CENTRA: Present Jim McLeod and Centra Consultants Steve West and Fred Perez.

Centra Consultants informed the Board that the Operation Plan and Conceptual Post Closure Plan was submitted last Friday to DEQ. They are expecting to hear back from DEQ in about 3 weeks. The consultants complimented the Board on their leadership in the matter. They are working on the Financial Assurance letter and will have it soon for the Clerk's Office to send to the County auditor.

The commissioners will meet with the consultants on Wednesday, December 2, 2015 at noon at the landfill.

SOLID WASTE MATTERS: Jim McLeod did have an update for the Board in regards to a 10 ft wide snow plow blade from Meckel that could be used with the backhoe at the Transfer Site. A frame needs to be build for the backhoe; Kyle Kirby could build the frame for about \$400 - \$500. The Board was in agreement with that.

LIQUOR LICENSES: The following liquor licenses were reviewed by the Board: Kahili Club, Li's Chinese Kitchen, Wilson's Lounge and Brundage Mountain. After review, Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve the liquor licenses. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

CAT BOARD – DISTRICT III NOMINATION: The CAT Program Board of Directors position for District III expires at the end of this year. After review, Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to nominate Rick Yzaguirre from ADA County for the position. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

LETTER OF SUPPORT/CITY OF COUNCIL: The Board approved a support letter for a Local Highway Technical Assistance Council grant that the City is applying for. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to sign the letter. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

ROAD & BRIDGE MATTERS: Present Road & Bridge Supervisor Kraig Spelman and Joe Warner.

Loader: Joe Warner joined the meeting to ask if the Board would be willing to help him get his loader from Murphy up to the rock pit. Discussion revolved around the height and width of the loader (7.1w x 10.1h), using a County operator, oversize permit and using a pilot car. The Board agreed to help.

IAC Conference in Boise: Kraig updated the Board on the conference he had attended and asked if the Board would agree to pay for an \$80.00 membership fee. The Board was in agreement.

Snow Plowing: Kraig was told by Curtis Bennett (Valley County) that they might not be plowing lower parking lots; the matter needs to be discussed with Valley County Commissioners. Another issue discussed was creating a generic letter to hand out to persons parking their vehicles in right-of-ways. The Board directed Kraig to inform Chris Friend to draft a letter.

Agreement for Utilities: Discussed was creating and adopting an agreement to mail to utilities that can be used before they can work in County right-of-ways.

New Meadows Shop: The garage door will be installed today, doors should all be done this week, plumbing was finished, and heat is in the building.

Middle Fork Road: Kraig told the Board that the project on the Middle Fork has been finished.

Annual Road & Bridge Report: After review, Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to approve the annual report. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

SHERIFF MATTERS: Present Sheriff Ryan Zollman. Sheriff Zollman told the Board about looking to purchase a new meat/cheese slicer for the Jail. The cost for an industrial strength one is between \$800 - \$1,200. He will speak with Vic Ludwig to see if he will part with the one at Council Valley Market.

Executive Session with Ryan Zollman: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, moves that the Board, pursuant to Idaho Code § 74-206 (1)(b), convene in Executive Session per Idaho Code § 74-206 (1) (b) seconded by Commissioner Mike Paradis and carried unanimously to go into Executive Session. The Executive Session purpose is to discuss personnel matters. The vote to do so is by roll call vote as follows: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, aye and Mike Paradis, Commissioner, aye.

Out of Executive Session: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to move out of Executive Session. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote. No action was taken.

PACKER JOHN PARK MAINTENANCE: Present Rod Pratt, Morris Krigbaum, Carolyn Chapman, Marla Krigbaum. The Adams County Historical Society members came before the Board to discuss short and long-term goals for the park. They are concerned that maintenance with volunteers does not work for the long term; a rebuilt replica cabin would not be a good idea, because in the end it attracts more vandals than other visitors. They recommended for the commissioners to contact the Idaho State Historical Society for their recommendation. The members suggested building posted shelters with picnic tables, interpretive signs, nature trails. The park has different unique zones, from aquatic to forest land in addition to the historical value. Suggested was to let someone live there as a caretaker during the summer months and close the park in wintertime. Commissioner Mike Paradis mentioned the Parks and Rec Fund, that there is some money there that could be used. The Board will discuss the topic further.

Ron Hamilton and Bryan Rickard from Mike Crapo's office joined the meeting at 11:35 a.m.

LUNCH: The Board broke for lunch. They were joined by Mr. Hamilton and Mr. Rickard.

Education and some limited control may be possible, but the Milfoil is spread throughout the reservoir and any action would have to involve many stakeholders because of the boundary waters and steelhead.

I provided some extra "Clean-Drain-Dry" signs to Kory Allred to use on any of the boat ramps that don't already have them.




