Commissioner Bill Brown opened the Adams County Commissioner meeting at 9:10 a.m.

MOTION AND ORDER TO AMEND AGENDA:

No items were presented to amend the agenda at this time.

OLD BUSINESS:

Packer John Park: No discussion was held at this time.

NEW BUSINESS:

EXECUTIVE SESSION MOTION AND ORDER FOR INDIGENT MATTERS: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, moves that the Board, pursuant to Idaho Code § 74-206, convene in Executive Session to: consider legal matters Idaho Code § 74-206 (1) (D) seconded by Commissioner Mike Paradis and carried unanimously to go into Executive Session. The purpose and topic is Indigent Matters. The vote to do so is by roll call vote as follows: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, aye, Mike Paradis, Commissioner, aye, and Bill Brown, Chairman, aye.

Out of Executive Session: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to move out of Executive Session. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Presented was Indigent Claim #2016-04 – Findings of Fact, Order of Reimbursement and Determination.

Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to approve the Determination, Findings of Fact and Order of Reimbursement for Indigent Claim #2016-04. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

COMMISSIONER MINUTES: Minutes for the June 20, 2016 and June 27, 2016 commissioner meetings were reviewed. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve the commissioner minutes for June 20, 2016 and June 27, 2016. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

RESOLUTION 2016-04/WALKER TIMBERLINE SUBDIVISION/ASSESSOR DEPT:

The resolution was by request from the Assessor Department to acknowledge action taken by the Board of Commissioners in 2008. The action from February 25, 2008, by the Board of Commissioners of Adams County, Idaho does hereby vacate a portion of Walker Way of the Walker Timberline Subdivision found in Township 19 North Range 1 East, Section 36, Boise Meridian. In addition, dedicating a portion of the original Lot 6 Block 3 to access the unvacated portion of Walker Way, all as described on the Record of Survey #114880. After review, Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to approve and sign Resolution #2016-04. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

ALLIED BUSINESS SOLUTIONS: The following addendums to lease agreements between Allied Business Solutions and Adams County were reviewed: Clerk,

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July 11, 2016 – Allied Business Solutions Continued:

Agreement #1165674, Building Department, Agreement #1165775 and Extension Agency, Agreement number unknown at this time. The addendum states that if a government entity loses their funding and does not have funds in their budget to continue, the County is not responsible for the remainder of the lease. The leasing company would remove the equipment and the County would not have to pay off the term, releasing the County of the obligation. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve and sign the addendums. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

ADAMS SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT: The Board reviewed the fiscal 2016 request for office space & utilities in the amount of \$2,400.00 and County funds allocation in the amount of \$4,000.00. After discussion, Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve and sign the fiscal 2016 request. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

MOTION AND ORDER TO AMEND AGENDA: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, moves that this governing body, pursuant to Idaho Code §74-204, amend the agenda for the meeting as follows:

- To disband the Planning & Zoning Commission

The listed amendment is time sensitive and needs to be addressed. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion to amend agenda. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION: The Board realized that it did not properly motion on the dissolution of the P&Z Commission. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to disband the P&Z Commission because of the reduced amount of activity. The Board of Commissioners said they could take care of any business until the County picks up in the future. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

RESCINDING PLANNING AND ZONING MOTION: Later in the afternoon, the Board realized they have violated open meeting law regarding the dissolution of the Planning & Zoning Commission; therefore, a motion was made to rescind today's motion. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to rescind today's motion on dissolution of the Planning & Zoning Commission. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

The Board will properly notify the public regarding the Planning and Zoning Commission dissolution on Monday, July 18, 2016, at that time the Board will rescind the June 27, 2016 motion and properly motion on the dissolution.

CLAIMS/PAYROLL AND DEMANDS: Joe Holmes, Commissioner, reviewed all claims presented on July 11, 2016 in the amount of \$170,298.78 and payroll for July 8, 2016. Joe Holmes, Commissioner, made a motion to approve said claims and payroll. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (BOE): Joe Holmes, Commissioner, moves that the Board, pursuant to Idaho Code moved to Board of Equalization. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously to go into Board of Equalization.

He explained that for each hearing, the appellant would be given an opportunity to make a presentation, after which the appraiser will give a factual presentation on how the assessed value was established. Each appellant will then have a chance to provide final rebuttal, after which the Board would make their decision. Linda Morris was allowed to explain why she believes her value should be \$675,000.00. BOARD OF EQUALIZATION – FOOTE, THOMAS PROPERTY:





Commissioner Mike Paradis opened the Adams County Commissioner meeting at 9:10 a.m.

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July 18, 2016 – Continued:

*Commissioner Bill Brown joined the meeting at approximately 9:30 a.m.

MOTION AND ORDER TO AMEND AGENDA:

No items were received to amend the agenda for this meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

MUD-DRAG: HEARTLAND COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION (HCIA):

Present for the Mud-Drag discussion are the following:

Adjacent Landowners: Gary Poole, Ferrell Crossley, Charlie Caruso, Mike McNally, three additional individuals were late arrivals – no names were given,

Indian Valley Fire District Representatives: Keith Heil and Tim Toomey,

HCIA Representatives: Mike Poff,

Property Owners: Skip and Toni Burnett,

County Representatives: Don Horton and Sheriff Ryan Zollman.

The discussion was started by Commissioner Mike Paradis asking Mike Poff to give a description of the 3-day event starting on Monday, August 26th and ending on Sunday, August 28th. The event will have Mud-Drag events, camping, vending and live music. The location of the event is at 1671 Goodrich Creek Road. Mr. Poff first apologized for not coming to the Board earlier. Poff next described the mission behind HCIA, and then explained in detail the fire plan. Mr. Poff said he also met with Tim Toomey on Saturday. Commissioner Bill Brown asked why Indian Valley Fire could not station a fire truck at the event to help if a fire broke out. Toomey stated it would be too costly. The next issues addressed were the road, traffic and emergency issues. Several landowners expressed their concerns regarding the event, including Ferrell Crossley asking where the water was going to come from to create the mud for the events. Poff stated he would have a water truck deliver water.

Later, after individuals left, the commissioners contacted Mike Poff stating the event falls under the Conditional Use Permit process. The CUP process will need a 15-day window to allow for the public to be notified.

ROAD AND BRIDGE MATTERS: Present are the following: Kraig Spelman, Jim McLeod and Chad from Western States/Cat.

Front-End Loader: Western States brought up to Adams County a front-end loader to try out for a possible purchase for the landfill. Chad had prepared estimates for review. The Board will discuss more at the next meeting.

Local Rural Highway Investment Program (LRHIP): Close-out documents for the matching grant funds for the Middle Fork Wash-out project were reviewed by the Board. After discussion Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve and sign LRHIP documents. Bill Brown, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Dump Truck Purchase: The Board confirmed to Kraig Spelman that the 2003 International dump truck for \$58,000.00 was a good purchase for the County and to move forward with the purchase. The funds will be taken out of Capital Projects – Road & Bridge.

New Meadows Shop: Kraig Spelman stated the costs for the shop will be approximately \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00, broken down as follows: Insulation for \$16,300.00, heat for \$8,000.00 and electrical costs for the remaining expenses.

SOLID WASTE MATTERS: Present Jim McLeod.

Tires: Jim McLeod reported to the Board a truck load of tires were shipped out last week with a \$2.50 per tire cost.

July 18, 2016 – Solid Waste Matters Continued:

Aluminum: Jim reported the aluminum prices have not gone up since last discussed. The Board stated to not sale the aluminum bales and to wait for the price to increase.

SHERIFF MATTERS: Present Sheriff Zollman. Presented to the Board was the Fiscal 2017 Annual Law Enforcement Agreement with the City of New Meadows for review and approval. The annual amount is for \$33,660.00. After discussion, Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve and sign the City of New Meadows Law Enforcement Agreement. Bill Brown, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

New Hire: A payroll change for new hire Ronni Perkins starting at 5A, \$14.35/hour was reviewed. After discussion, Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve and sign the change form for Ronni Perkins. Bill Brown, Commissioner, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

QUARTERLY JAIL INSPECTION: The Board completed their quarterly inspection.

COMMISSIONER MINUTES: Minutes for the July 11, 2016 commissioner meeting were reviewed. Mike Paradis, Commissioner, made a motion to approve the commissioner minutes for June 20, 2016 and June 27, 2016. Joe Holmes, Commissioner seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.




July 14, 2016: Sprayed Price Valley Road and Lost Valley Road.


