Chairman Bill Brown was not present at the meeting.

Whereupon the following proceedings are had, to-wit:

Commissioner Mike Paradis opened the Adams County Commissioner meeting at 9:15 a.m.

AMENDMENTS TO AGENDA:

Don Horton's Wages partially covered by Homeland Security Administrative Revenue Valley County Juvenile Detention Agreement – Approval/Signature
Cottonwood Road/CJ Ranch Court Trial

Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and amend the agenda for the listed items due to receiving them at the last minute. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Solid Waste Supervisor – Bill Brown: No discussion was held at this meeting.

Altman Property – County Costs-Supports/Lien: No discussion was held at this meeting. Prosecutor Matthew Faulks will wait to offer an opinion until after he has reviewed the history.

NEW BUSINESS:

COMMISSIONER MINUTES: The minutes for August 18, 2014 and August 25, 2014 were reviewed. Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve the minutes for August 18th and August 25th. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

CERTIFICATE OF RESIDENCY: A certificate of residency form for Azucena Gonzalez Meza for the Fall 2014 term was reviewed. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve and sign the certificate. Commissioner Joe Holmes seconded the motion. The motion carried.

CAPITAL OUTLAY: Treasurer Christy Wilson asked for two office chairs to be removed from Capital Outlay. Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve the removal. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

LITTLE SALMON RIVER - GARBAGE SERVICE: Commissioner Joe Holmes and Commissioner Mike Paradis discussed the lack of garbage service in the Elk Lake Road area. Both commissioners believe some sort of service needs to be provided. There will be more discussion on the subject in the future.

PUBLIC ROAD EASEMENT: Road #50165/Mill Creek and Road#58025/Old Cascade Road: The Board received a prepared document from the Council Ranger District for the above listed public road easement. After review, Commissioner Mike Paradis asked for the discussion to be tabled because of a culvert issue.

SOLID WASTE: Solid Waste Supervisor Jim McLeod asked the County to pay for a sorting table that was made by John McDaniel. After discussion, the Board directed Jim to have an invoice prepared and the Board will review and pay.

Meckel Contract: The Board reviewed the contract for hauling construction and demolition debris/waste from the New Meadows Transfer Site to the Goodrich Landfill. The rate is \$95.00 per hour for truck and operator, \$50.00 per month for container rentals. After some discussion, Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the contract. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

ROAD & BRIDGE MATTERS: Present Chris Friend and Tom Glenn.

Vision Link: Chris Friend told the Board of receiving a gift card from Caterpillar for the hardship caused by the software for the new patrol. The gift card is for \$500.00; Chris asked for permission to purchase sweatshirts for each of the employees. The Board agreed to the purchase of the sweatshirts.

Boat Dock: Tom Glenn is meeting with the contractor for the Lost Valley Reservoir boat dock project.

SHERIFF MATTERS: Present Sheriff Ryan Zollman.

State Inmate Count: 26 inmates are currently housed at the County Jail.

\$1, 000.00 DONATION: The County received a \$1,000.00 donation from Ann Swanson of Boise. The letter stated the Adams County Preservation Committee has always done an outstanding job and she wanted to help the committee out. The funds will be sent to the committee for further preservation use.

Sprinklers for the Old Courthouse: Commissioner Mike Paradis said the County has some funds in the Parks and Recreation fund to use toward getting a sprinkler system built.

INDIGENT MATTERS: Claim #2014-02 for Order of Reimbursement was reviewed. Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the order of reimbursement. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

JUVENILE DETENTION AGREEMENT VALLEY AND ADAMS COUNTIES: The County received the annual agreement for signature. For juveniles to be housed in the Valley County Juvenile Detention Center the charge will be \$100.00 per day. After discussion, Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the agreement. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

DON HORTON/HOMELAND SECURITY REVENUE: The administration revenue that the County received from Homeland Security will be used to cover Don Horton's wages for the current fiscal and fiscal 2013. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve the use of the funds. Commissioner Joe Holmes seconded the motion. The motion carried.

CANVASS OF THE COUNCIL SCHOOL DISTRICT #13 LEVY: After review and canvass of the vote, the count remains unchanged, 262 yes and 154 no votes.

September 2, 2014 – Canvass of Votes Continued:


Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve and certify the canvass of votes. Commissioner Joe Holmes seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Chairman Bill Brown was not present at the meeting.

Whereupon the following proceedings are had, to-wit:

Present: Lyle Sall of The Adams County Record.

Commissioner Mike Paradis opened the Adams County Commissioner meeting at 9:25 a.m.

AMENDMENTS TO AGENDA: No additions were received to the agenda.

OLD BUSINESS:

Solid Waste Supervisor – Bill Brown: No discussion was held at this meeting.

Altman Property – County Costs-Supports/Lien: No discussion was held at this meeting. Prosecutor Matthew Faulks will wait to offer an opinion until after he has reviewed the history.

NEW BUSINESS:

COMMISSIONER MINUTES: Minutes are ready for review.

INTERIM CLAIMS - JOE HOLMES: After review of the claims, Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve the interim claims in the amount of \$12,779.81 and the August 22, 2014 payroll. Commissioner Joe Holmes seconded the motion. The motion carried.

CERTIFICATE OF RESIDENCY: A certificate of residency for Caitlin Hill was reviewed.

September 15, 2014 – Certificate of Residency Continued:

Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the certificate of residency. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

INDIGENT MATTERS: Presented were three lien releases, #2013-07, #2014-01 and #2014-03, and one assignment of lien for claim #2014-06.

After review, Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the three lien releases and the assignment of lien. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

COMPUTER ARTS AGREEMENT (CAI): The Board reviewed the annual CAI agreement in the amount of \$20,040.00, no increase from the prior year. Clerk Ward asked for the ability to scan payables for an additional cost of \$500.00 per year. After discussion, Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the agreement with the addition of financial imaging. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION FOR PETITION TO CONGRESS: Resolution #2014-11 was prepared for the Board to sign. The resolution makes the statement that the County is extremely frustrated with the Forest Service and BLM in the way they do not manage the lands. Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign Resolution #2014-11. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE PERSON: The Board was informed that Title III employee, Chester DeGroat would like to become a shared employee and be used to perform the County Courthouse maintenance. The Board would like for Chester to do the maintenance work with giving the employee Persi benefits but no insurance. The Clerk will prepare a change notice to motion on during the next meeting.

CERTIFICATION OF LEVIES: The Clerk prepared the 2014 levies (L1 form) for the County and all taxing districts. Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve the levies for 2014. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

ROAD & BRIDGE MATTERS: Present Tom Glenn, City of Council Mayor Bruce Gardner, David Wilson, Holladay Engineer Doug Argo, Wendy Green and City Clerk Tami Testa.

City of Council Sewer Lagoon Work: City of Council Engineer, Doug Argo, started the conversation by handing each commissioner drawings of the sewer lagoon work. In the spring of 2013 damage was done to the lagoon and repairs were made, but more work is needed. To armor the levy, the City of Council went for a \$100,000.00 block grant. The City is asking for the County to help with the work because the grant is not sufficient for labor and the required rock. Commissioner Mike Paradis stated he had misunderstood and thought that the work the County helped out with last year was all that was needed. The Mayor affirmed there is approximately one more month of work. Tom Glenn stated he could spare the equipment for only two to three days. Mayor Gardner thought they could lease a piece of equipment and have a City employee run the machine.

C&M Lumber Approach to Business: Chris and Mark Peterson, owners of C&M Lumber, were present to discuss the approach issue. Mark Peterson explained, when the Walker Subdivision was being developed, part of the agreement included an apron to be placed at the entrance to the C&M Lumber business. After some more discussion it was clear that this was part of the prior negotiations and needed to be taken care of. Commissioner Mike Paradis directed Commissioner Joe Holmes to contact Knife River to add the work onto their schedule because they are doing work in the New Meadows area and to send the bill to the County.

Compactor: The compactor equipment at the landfill will need to be worked on at the County shop. The Board directed Tom Glenn to get the repairs done.

SHERIFF MATTERS: Present UnderSheriff Jeff Brown.

State Inmate Count: 25 inmates were housed this week at the County Jail.

City of Council Annual Agreement: UnderSheriff Jeff Brown presented the 2014 Annual City of Council Agreement for \$57,250.00 for approval and signature. Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the agreement. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Payroll Change Notice: A change notice was presented for Norma Jacobs for the end of her probationary period, a move from 5a/\$13.52 to 5c/\$14.35 per hour. Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion to approve and sign the payroll change notice. Commissioner Mike Paradis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Juvenile Probation Officer Marcy Combs – Quarterly Update: The update will be rescheduled.


FOREST SERVICE UPDATE: Present Melanie Vining, Council Ranger District and Kim Pierson, New Meadows Ranger.



Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve and amend the agenda for the listed item due to receiving it at the last minute. Commissioner Bill Brown seconded the motion. The motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Solid Waste Supervisor Position Description – Bill Brown: No discussion was held at this meeting.

Altman Property – County Costs-Supports/Lien: No discussion was held at this meeting. Prosecutor Matthew Faulks will wait to offer an opinion until after he has reviewed the history.

NEW BUSINESS:

COMMISSIONER MINUTES: The minutes for September 2, 2014 and September 15, 2014 were reviewed. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve the minutes for both meetings. Commissioner Bill Brown seconded the motion. The motion carried.

SOLID WASTE FOLLOW-UP MEETING: Present were Solid Waste Supervisor Jim McLeod, Recycling Operator Melvin Jenkins and Recycling Operator Sam Wagner.

Recycling: This meeting is a follow-up to make sure all concerns by all parties are addressed. The recycling is being delivered to Council timely. Both, Melvin Jenkins and Jim McLeod stated Sam Wagner is doing an outstanding job. Jim McLeod said Lakeshore picked up bins at the Transfer Site on Friday, September 19, 2014.

Western Recycling Baler: Melvin Jenkins stated the old baler is in the way and looks trashy out in front of the Recycling Building.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP) - CHEVERTON: Present were Conditional Use Permit (CUP) applicant Richard Cheverton, Glenn Beal, Planning and Zoning Administrator Don Horton, Tim Frahm and Don Sherry. Before the CUP was addressed, Commissioner Mike Paradis disqualified himself due to being an adjacent landowner to Richard Cheverton. The meeting was delayed due to Commissioner Mike Paradis removing himself and Commissioner Joe Holmes not being available until 11:00 a.m. The discussion was tabled until that point. The Board was given documentation with the recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission. The recommendation was to deny the application.

Commissioner Joe Holmes joined the meeting at 11:10 a.m.

Don Horton stated the following to the Board: “You have before you a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission (PZ). The meeting today is like an appeal to the PZ decision. If you decide to grant the amendment to the CUP, a public hearing will need to be set”.

Commissioner Joe Holmes: The PZ commission recommends not to approve.

Commissioner Bill Brown: The meeting will start with Richard Cheverton stating what he would like to say, and then others will be heard.

Don Horton: This is not a hearing; this is an appeal for another hearing.

Commissioner Bill Brown: I understand.

Don Horton: Wants all parties to understand the Board will not be granting a CUP, an additional public hearing is required for that procedure.

Richard Cheverton: Most have read my proposal, I am asking for an addendum to my existing CUP (for boat fabrication and maintenance). The proposal is in the same format that I used in Alaska, looking for unique inventory and a niche in the market. Office will be inside shop, signage will be on building.

Glen Beal: I am a landowner in Adams County for some 20 years. I have read the opposition letters and they are not facts but assumptions. Letters talk about additional

traffic and I understand test driving will be on Highway 95, not Mill Creek Road. I can personally attest that the property will be cleaned up and organized. The decision should be based on facts, possibly 8-10 vehicles, repairs will be offsite, no ground pollutions, clean, organized and no traffic congestion. Proposed hours will be 6 days a week, 9-5.

Commissioner Bill Brown: Question to Don Horton on the existing CUP, is Rick allowed to sell boats?

Don Horton: No, the CUP is for maintenance only.

Tim Frahm: I am an adjacent landowner, lived on our property for 12 years, bought the property for the rural living. I dislike "For Sale" on stuff because it is a reminder of a yard sale. I believe the car lot will diminish my property value and will escalate to something else.

Don Sherry: I own acreage and a home facing the proposed car lot and it looks like a junk pile already. My wife and I came to live here for the small community and rural life style.

Commissioner Bill Brown: The Board will need to deliberate on this and make a decision to uphold or deny the recommendation of the PZ.

Don Horton: This is an appeal for the PZ decision.

Richard Cheverton: Was never aware we were appealing, have never been told of PZ decision.

Don Horton: The fact that you came to this meeting asking for change of decision...

Richard Cheverton: I did not know they made a decision.

Commissioner Bill Brown: You did not know PZ made a decision?

Richard Cheverton: No.

Glenn Beal: We have been given nothing.

Richard Cheverton: We were told we had to go before the Board of Commissioners like I did on the original CUP.

Don Sherry: It was stated at the meeting; they know that, we were all at the same meeting.

Commissioner Bill Brown: The letter from PZ states not to be amended for used vehicle sales based on Adams County zoning ordinance for ATG and to encourage Richard Cheverton to look for a better site with proper zoning. The letter stated cc to Richard Cheverton.

Commissioner Bill Brown: You were at the meeting.

Commissioner Joe Holmes: You never got the letter?

Commissioner Bill Brown: You were at the meeting and heard this?

Richard Cheverton: Yeah... I heard their negativity, there is no doubt. I did not receive a letter.

Richard Cheverton: The day after the PZ hearing I went to Don's office and talked with Pam. I asked her what the next step in the process will be and it was to meet with the Commission. I was called by Pam this morning as a reminder.

Commissioner Bill Brown: We will take matter under advisement and possibly make a decision today, if not at the October 14th meeting.

After some discussion, Commissioner Joe Holmes made a motion on the Richard Cheverton application to amend current CUP – to deny request for change and uphold the Planning and Zoning recommendation. Commissioner Bill Brown seconded that motion. The motion carried.

CERTIFICATE OF RESIDENCY: A certificate of residency for Savannah Schaffer and David Lee Byers was reviewed. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve and sign the two certificates of residency. Commissioner Joe Holmes seconded the motion. The motion carried.

SAFETY MEETINGS: The Clerk asked for the Board to establish safety meetings once a week for the County Road & Bridge, Sheriff and Ambulance Departments. These departments have the highest work related claims. The Board, at the request of the Clerk, stated weekly or biweekly meetings help, the discussion should be documented at the meetings and the employees listed with their signatures. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve the establishment of safety meetings and directed

Tom Glenn to initiate the meetings with Road and Bridge. Commissioner Bill Brown seconded the motion. The motion carried.

PAYROLL CHANGE: The Clerk presented a payroll change for Chester DeGroat, who is currently a part-time/seasonal employee for Senior Firewood and Title III work for the County. Chester will be doing Courthouse maintenance when needed per the Board's discussion from last week. The new rate of pay for Chester will be at 5D/\$15.22 per hour, no health insurance, prorated sick, holiday and Persi benefits. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve and sign the payroll change. Commissioner Bill Brown seconded the motion. The motion carried.

ROAD & BRIDGE MATTERS: Present Road & Bridge Supervisor Tom Glenn.

Boat Dock: Tom Glenn stated the new dock was placed last Friday with the County helping in the installation.

Removal of Old Desks: The Clerk asked Tom Glenn if he would please remove and discard the old desks.

C&M Business Approach: Tom Glenn stated he has prepared the approach for asphaltting.

LHTAC GRANT: The County's \$100,000.00 LHTAC grant was reviewed for possible extension. The work will begin in 2015; therefore, no extension is necessary according to Chris Friend.

SHERIFF MATTERS: Present was Sheriff Ryan Zollman.

State Inmate Count: 23 inmates are currently housed at the County Jail.

No concerns or matters were discussed at this meeting.

CAPITAL OUTLAY: The Assessor asked for two printers to be discarded due to no longer being used. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve the removal. Commissioner Bill Brown seconded the motion. The motion carried.

PUBLIC DEFENDER AGREEMENT: The Board reviewed the annual agreement; the agreement included a 3% cost of living increase. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve the agreement. Commissioner Bill Brown seconded the motion. The motion carried.

PATHOLOGY AGREEMENT WITH ADA COUNTY: The Board reviewed the annual pathology agreement with Ada County. The Clerk stated that she sent it via email to Sue Warner for review. The Clerk will check with Sue Warner one more time prior to sending the copy back to Ada County. Commissioner Mike Paradis made a motion to approve and sign the agreement. New Meadows: Stan cleaned ditch and pulled brush on Branstetter Lane, Lamont hauled away brush and muck.

September 22, 2014 – Road & Bridge Weekly Log Continued:

Council: Martin off. Darrel placed rock for Gilman approach and worked on upper MF slide area. Greg hauled rock for Gilman approach and cut brush on West Fork, C/C and Wildhorse roads. Vern transported roller from NM and hauled backhoe to MF for Darrel. Ed watered S IV road for blading. Chris worked in the office projects. Marion worked on #17, #69 and #207.

New Meadows: Stan moved culvert to Hubbard and Southend roads. Lamont worked on signs on Whitefield and new 25 MP sign Hot Springs Road, and worked on culverts on Southend and Hubbard roads.

Council: Marion off. Martin and Chris attended Cottonwood Road trial. Darrel cleaned ditch on Missman Road. Greg, Vern and Ed hauled ditch muck from Mill Ck Road and gravel to Mundy Gulch Road, gravel on side of new asphalt. Dan worked on #39, Assessors Explorer, moved #6 to IV and ran backhoe on Mundy Gulch Road.

Indian Valley: Bill laid gravel on Mundy Gulch Road.

Tuesday: September 9, 2014

New Meadows: Stan cleaned ditch on Branstetter Road. Lamont hauled gravel for Branstetter ditch and hauled away muck.

Council: Marion off. Darrel, Bill, Greg and Chris at Cottonwood Road trial. Martin checked West Fork, Ridge, Mill and Gaylord roads for blading. Ed hauled gravel to Mundy Gulch Road for sides of new asphalt and washed the road with water truck. Greg worked in the shop. Wednesday: September 10, 2014

Council: Marion off. Martin bladed on C/C Road. Vern and Ed cut brush on C/C Road, hauled trackhoe to town, patched asphalt on recycle center and piled brush on Shaw Lane. Darrel worked on IV fuel tank and Mundy Gulch Road. Chris worked on bills and road logs.

Indian Valley: Bill worked on signs, ditches, in the shop and on the backhoe. Greg mowed ROW on Mundy Gulch Road.

Thursday: September 11, 2014

New Meadows: Stan installed culverts for Branstetter Road. Lamont hauled gravel and rock for culvert on Branstetter Road.

Council: Marion and Darrel off. Martin bladed on Middle Fork Road from Hwy 95 past Yantis then worked on area up towards Fall Ck, Vern rolled it, Ed watered it. Chris worked on road logs and charged new cell phones.

Indian Valley: Bill worked on rock rake, patrol and signs. Greg mowed ROW on Cutoff, Meadow Lane and Mesa Roads.

WEED DEPARTMENT WEEKLY LOG: July 21 - August 1, 2014

July 21, 2014: Crew sprays Hot Springs, Zims, 45th Parallel, Old 95 and Lost Valley Res Road. I meet with the Commissioners for public hearing on the BLM budget, inspect Madsen's stack yard for WFFS, then haul the Polaris UTV to the dealer in McCall for repair.

July 22, 2014: Crew sprays remainder of Hot Springs, Zims, Salmon River Ct., parts of Rim Road. I work on cleanup, a pump diaphragm failed on backpack #14 while in the chemical room. Following that I spray spotted knapweed on Winkler Cemetery. Crew helps Chris Friend with setup for the CWMA booth for the fair.

July 23, 2014: Crew continues working on roadsides in the Price Valley area, Rim Rd., Price Valley Sub, Tamarack View Drive, West Pine Drive, Pine Meadow Ct., Ridgeway Ct. I work on rush skeletonweed on roadsides in the Goodrich area. Prep for the CWMA spray day at Rubicon tomorrow.

July 24, 2014: CWMA spray day at Rubicon. 8 people participated, working to kill weeds from the Strawberry area to Old Highway 95. Over 100 acres treated.

July 25, 2014: Crew off. I release 10,000 *aphthona* beetles for leafy spurge bio-control on the state of Idaho ground north of the Goodrich Landfill.

July 28, 2014: Crew off. I spray Middle Fork Road from Sheep Creek trailhead to the bridge at Cabin Creek.

July 29, 2014: CWMA spray day on Little Salmon River corridor. Idaho County sent three people, Payette National Forest sent 5, and we had three. Lots of knapweed, Canada thistle and Dalmatian toadflax were sprayed from the County line to Smokey Boulder Road. Pines Road was also sprayed.

July 30, 2014: Hilarie Murphy off today. Chris York and I spray Middle Fork Rd from Cabin Creek to the County line.

September 22, 2014 – Weed Department Weekly Log Continued:

July 31, 2014: Chris and Hilarie spray Mud Creek, Farrell and State Shed Roads. I spray Middle Fork Road from Corral Creek to Cabin Creek and from Fall Creek Road to an unnamed creek just past the state gravel pit.

August 1, 2014: Crew completes spraying on Mud Creek, then does Cemetery Road, the access to the cemetery, and Fields Lane. I work on Kleinschmidt Grade, from a turnout 1.7 miles past the Bokides Ranch to another turnout 2.6 miles down the grade.

WEED DEPARTMENT WEEKLY LOG: August 4 - August 15, 2014

August 4, 2014: Crew sprays portions of Campbell Road and Circle C Lane before wind speeds became too high to continue. I met with landowner Greg Coman in the Meadowcreek area to walk his property and make some recommendations on his weed control program. Emailed him a list of our local spray contractors. Worked on repairing the spray gun on the GMC truck, which has been leaking. VRS repaired a rock chip in the GMC's windshield.

August 5, 2014: Hilarie off. Chris York and I spray puncturevine on Galena, Council Avenue at the City Hall and Galena, then spray roadsides for rush skeletonweed on Lappin and Spring Creek/Poverty Flats. Following this we spray puncturevine at the RV Dump Station and Russian thistle along Boise Cascade Avenue around the Road and Bridge shop. Drain and rinse the chem tank on the GMC and I begin disassembly of the pump on the spray rig, which has been leaking and needs to have the seals replaced. Emailed contractor list to a landowner in Whitney Ranch.

August 6, 2014: Continued pump disassembly. Crew sprays roadsides on Campbell Lane, Branstetter Lane and Cemetery Road.

August 7, 2014: Begin pump re-assembly, now waiting for parts. Maintenance on backpack sprayers. Crew sprayed roadsides on Wallace Lane, Osprey Circle, Tamarack Circle, Warm Springs Circle, Shadow Pine Circle, Osprey Court, Meadows View Circle and Canyon Creek Way.

August 8, 2014: Crew off. I spray Wildhorse River Road. Consult with landowner Lori Quilliam regarding some weed species on her property. Returning to shop I find Payette National Forest Dispatch wants the weed wash unit for a fire near Cascade. Spend several hours working that out.

August 10, 2014: In early to help Chester DeGroat and crew hook up the weed washer unit and head to Cascade.

August 11, 2014: Crew sprays roadside on Hubbard Lane, South End Road, Carr Rd, Kings Pines Subdivision (Club Hill, Harrington Place, Whitefield). I met with the commissioners for a quick update on dept activities, particularly the weed wash unit work. I spray roadsides on North Galena, Airport (to the trail crossing) Council Avenue and Industrial Avenue. I also spray some Russian thistle in the yard and around the Recycle Center and along Boise Cascade Avenue. Chester and crew returned from the East Mtn Fire in Cascade.

August 12, 2014: Winded out, crew leaves early. I retrieve the Polaris UTV from the dealer in McCall; they have repaired the fuel system and serviced the machine. I also worked on repairs to one of our ATV tank pumps that were broken earlier this year and upgrades/service to some of our backpacks.

August 13, 2014: I spray Crooked River Road, monitor Ditch Creek Road and treat a patch of Leafy spurge on Council-Cuprum Road near the intersection with Steve's Creek Road. Crew sprays Whitefield Lane, Longview Road, Ridge Drive and Meadowwood in the Rock Flat area. Crew rained out.

September 22, 2014 – Weed Department Weekly Log Continued:

August 14, 2014: Spray parking and roadside around the weed shop, recycle and Road & Bridge. Rained out. Crew leaves early. I meet with Kevin Madsen to walk one of his fields and recommend treatments to help him certify his hay. Work on backpack and UTV sprayers. Hilarie Murphy's last day.

August 15, 2014: Crew off today. Weather uncertain, thunderstorms lurking about. I order parts for repairs on the weed washer unit, lend ¾ ton GMC to the firewood crew. Visit New Meadows to collect specimen of a plant I don't recognize and can't find in our books. Monitor Campbell Rd, Brundage Rd and Fruitvale-Glendale Road on my way back to town.

WEED DEPARTMENT WEEKLY LOG: August 18 - August 29, 2014

August 18, 2014: Today Chris York and I sprayed Meadow Drive and Meadow Court in Price Valley; Raney Rd, Whitney Lane, Fish Lake Road and Substation Road in New Meadows for Common toadflax, Canada thistle and Spotted knapweed.

August 19, 2014: CWMA chemical to Wild Turkeys for Leafy spurge contract. Chris and I sprayed Farrel and Walker roads south of Hwy 55 and completed spraying on Campbell Creek Road from Browns Creek to the Forest boundary. Received grant modification agreement from USFS for \$15,000 in road spraying work.

August 20, 2014: Chris and I sprayed puncturevine, rush and hoary alyssum around the Clinic, Old Courthouse and on Council-Cuprum Road from the sale yard to Double R road. Windy in the afternoon, I work on GMC pump repair and the weed wash station hose reel repair. Chris worked on the application log for the day and then left a little early.

August 21, 2014: We spray Smokey Boulder, Bally Mtn, Black Bear and Bear Paw Ct. Windy in the afternoon, so we monitor and hand dig some puncturevine on North Hornet Creek Road, which was treated with a pre-emergent earlier this year.

August 22, 2014: We meet with Wild Turkeys Weed Control and tour the Leafy Spurge Contract areas with them. Excellent reduction in spurge in the areas sprayed. Following that we spray puncturevine on Goodrich Creek Road from the "Y" at the school to the end of maintenance on New Wilson Road.

August 25, 2014: We spray Leafy Spurge on the Walker property in New Meadows. This ground is being grazed by Royce Schwenkfelder. In the afternoon we spray puncturevine, Hoary Alyssum and rush on Council-Cuprum Road from MP 2.3 (Hornet Ridge Estates) to MP 5.5 (Old Hornet Road).

August 26, 2014: We spray puncturevine, Hoary Alyssum and rush on Council-Cuprum Road from MP 5.5 (Old Hornet Road) to MP 14.2 (Old Hornet Guard Station).

August 27, 2014: We spray puncturevine and rush on Little Weiser River Road from MP 5 to the Forest Bndry. Rush and puncturevine on Ben Ross Road and Anderson Road from the "Y" at Murphy Lane to the end of Anderson.

August 28, 2014: We backpack spray roadside on Hwy 55 from the county line at the Little Ski Hill to Woodland Lane at the bottom of Goose Creek grade. Chris and I are assisted by Brian McMorris from the New Meadows District PNF and his crewman, Jacob.

August 29, 2014: Chris and I spray rush skeletonweed on roadsides along Apple Lane, Mesa Road, Kilborn Lane and Highland Lane.

WEED DEPARTMENT WEEKLY LOG: September 1 - September 12, 2014

September 1, 2014: Labor Day Holiday.

Adams County Board of Commissioner Minutes

September 22, 2014 – Weed Department Weekly Log Continued:

September 2, 2014: Chris York and I spray the patches of Leafy Spurge on the County line above Blackhawk Lake on the Red Ridge Road on Potlatch.

September 3, 2014: This morning we sprayed the north-south run of Gray's Creek Road from the corner by Joe Holmes' place to the intersection with North Grays.

After lunch we met with Brandon Smith and Luis Urias, Ag Investigator and Program Specialist from the Idaho Dept. of Agriculture. This visit was a walk through and compliance inspection of the facilities, equipment and records. They did a walk around of the building, inspected spray trucks, checked the chemical storage areas and made "suggestions" to ensure that we are in compliance with ISDA regulation.

Following that they chose a couple of our daily application logs for each of us and went over them carefully to ensure that we are including all of the needed and required information for each day's application.

Overall, our compliance is good, only a few items needed attention: larger signs with emergency contact information on the building front, do not abbreviate product names on the forms, add a line specifying who (usually me, as weed supervisor) has recommended the treatment, add full property owner's address even for the County right-of-ways.

Following this, Chris worked on our forms to bring the information into compliance and I went to Zims in New Meadows to help teacher Brent LaFay release 200 *Cyphocleonus achates* beetles on the spotted knapweed there. This is part of a program the New Meadows and McCall schools are using to teach science.

September 4, 2014: We spray roadside on Gray's Creek from Indian Valley Road to Joe Holmes' place, Whiteman Lane, Short Lane and North Grays Creek.

September 5, 2014: We spray roadside on the north lane of Kleinschmidt Grade from MP 6.1 to the intersection with Hell's Canyon Road for puncturevine.

September 8, 2014: I report to the District Court for the Cottonwood Road dispute trial. Susan Weeks let me know that I wouldn't be needed until tomorrow. In connection with this, I ran a quick computer search to pull the dates we have worked on the Cottonwood Road 2006 to present. This is not exhaustive; because of the way the computer selects documents and emails in the search I could have missed some information. It appears that the department has performed either weed scouting, spraying or fuel reduction on 15 occasions since April of 2006.

Chris worked on spraying weeds around the Courthouse park and parking areas. I worked in the office, and then assisted Chris with spraying the old and new Courthouse lawns and parks.

September 9, 2014: Again this morning, Susan Weeks says she doesn't think she will need me to testify. Chris is spraying around the old and new Courthouses to kill grass and weeds that are growing in the asphalt and the concrete sidewalks. I am disassembling the Ace pump in the GMC 1 ton to see if I can diagnose why it is leaking. Found a cracked seal, so I've ordered a rebuild/seal kit for it.

September 10, 2014: Completed roadside spraying of Kleinschmidt Grade road from Speropolous Ranch to Hell's Canyon Park.

September 11, 2014: Windy, no spraying today. Office and inspect a field for Alvin Yantis for Weed Free Forage program.

September 12, 2014: To Caldwell to pick up chemical.

With no further business to come before the Board, the Board recessed until Tuesday, October 14, 2014.
